ABOUT RICHLAND COUNTY TRANSPORTATION PENNY

In 2012, Richland County voters approved a 1% Transportation: Penny sales tax to fund much-needed improvements across the County. Since then, the Penny has supported hundreds of projects that enhance daily travel and public infrastructure ranging from road widenings and intersection upgrades to paving dirt roads and building new sidewalks, bikeways, and greenways.

The Penny program is expected to generate a maximum of \$1.07 billion over 22 years or until the funding cap is reached, projected by late 2026. These investments span all 11 County Council districts and focus on three key areas:

ROADWAYS

\$656 million: Funding supports road widenings, intersection improvements, dirt road paving, resurfacing, special projects, and the Broad River Road/ I-20 interchange improvement.

IHE COMET TRANSIT SYSTEM

\$301 million: Supports enhanced mass transit through more frequent service, new and extended routes.

PEDESTRIAN, BIKEWAY & GREENWAY PROJECTS

\$81 million: Enhances mobility and safety for pedestrians and cyclists through sidewalks, bike paths, and greenways.
