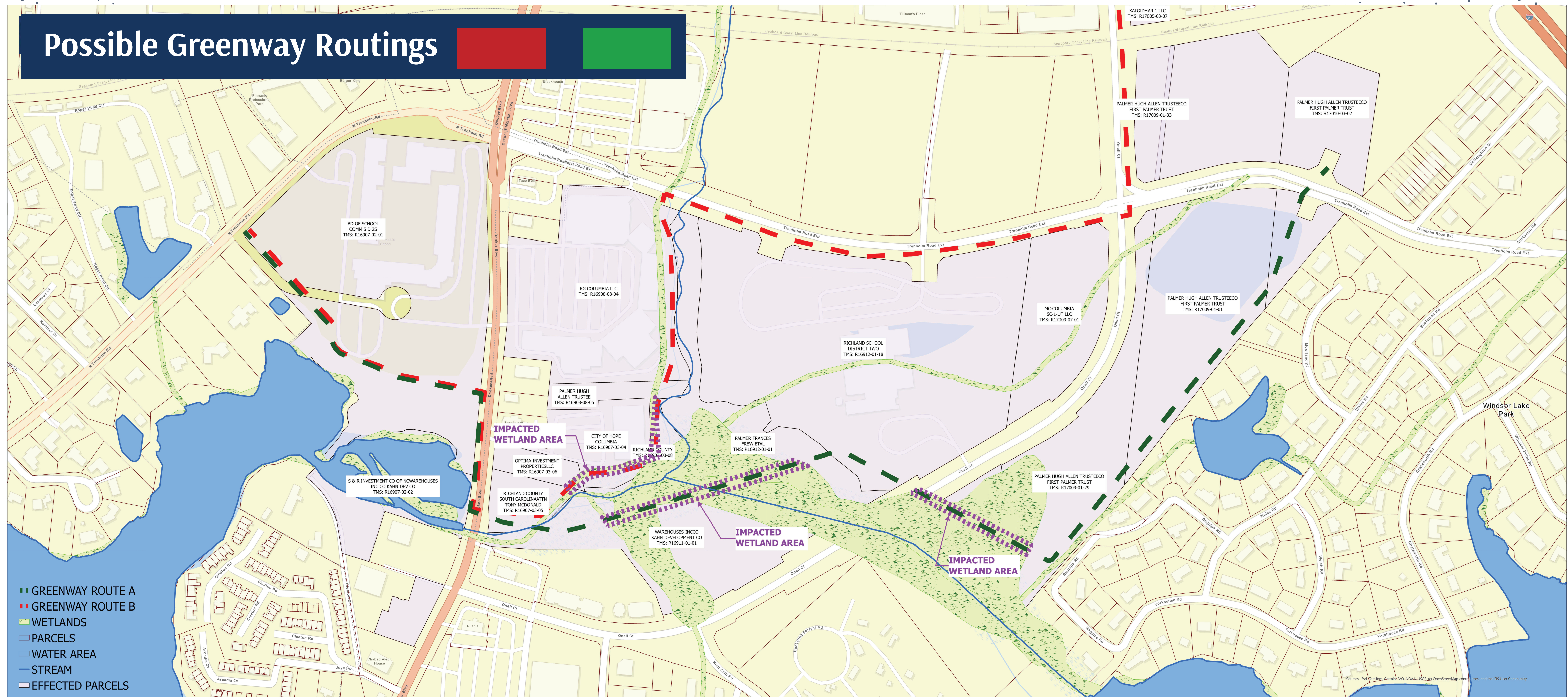

Environmental Constraints: Wetland Impact Areas

This exhibit also identifies wetland areas potentially impacted by the proposed greenway alignments. These areas are denoted in **purple** and have been delineated based on available environmental data and preliminary field assessments.

Both the **red** and **green** alignments have been evaluated for proximity to these sensitive environmental features. The presence of wetlands introduces additional permitting, design, and mitigation considerations under federal, state, and local environmental regulations (e.g., USACE Section 404, state buffer requirements).

Avoidance and minimization of wetland impacts remain a priority in the alignment selection process. Further environmental assessments will be conducted as the project advances to ensure compliance and identify opportunities for preservation, enhancement, or restoration of wetland functions where feasible.



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
